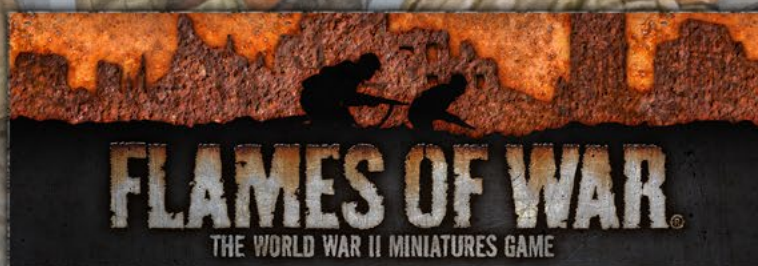
WAFFEN-SS ON THE EASTERN FRONT 1942-43

This supplement adds:

to German forces in *Eastern Front*.

1. SS-PANZERGRENADIER DIVISION

LEIBSTANDARTE SS ADOLF HITLER

Originally formed from members of Hitler's elite bodyguard (*Leibstandarte* in German) the LSSAH participated in the Polish and French campaigns as an independent infantry regiment. It was then stationed in France for refitting and extensive amphibious training prior to the proposed invasion of England. In 1941 it was moved to Romania and took part in the invasion of Yugoslavia and Greece.

It was then brought up to divisional status and joined Army Group South for the invasion of the Soviet Union. Later as part of Panzer Group 1, they were part of in the encirclement of Kiev and the capture of Rostov. A massive Soviet counterattack forced LSSAH out of Rostov. After heavy casualties they were withdrawn to France for refitting in August 1942. During this time they were re-designated as a Panzergrenadier division.

In February 1943, the deteriorating situation on the Soviet Front saw the division returned to the east as part of *II. SS-Panzerkorps* tasked with the holding of the city of Kharkov. Fierce fighting ensued and the commander of *II. SS-Panzerkorps*, Paul Hausser, ordered the city abandoned in spite of Hitler's order to hold at all cost.

Fighting a mobile battle, the Panzerkorps counterattacked on 23 February 1943, recapturing the city after three weeks of vicious fighting. The toll was high. *Leibstandarte* suffered some 4500 casualties. These battlefield casualties were made up by replacements taken from *Luftwaffe* personal, much to the disgust of the divisional commander, Sepp Dietrich.

During this time many of *Leibstandarte's* veteran officers and senior NCOs were also being transferred to form the nucleus around which a new division, *12. SS-Panzergrenadierdivision Hitlerjugend*, would be formed. In early July 1943, Dietrich left to form *I. SS-Panzerkorps* and the division passed to the command of Theodore 'Teddy' Wisch.

On 5 July 1943, *Leibstandarte* spearheaded the southern pincer in the Battle of Kursk. Initially good progress was made and by mid July the division was fighting on the outskirts of the city. On 12 July 1943, SS armour clashed with Soviet armour in a major action outside the village of Prokhorovka in one of the largest armoured battles of the war.

Following Kursk, and the Allied invasion of Italy, LSSAH was withdrawn to Italy and employed in anti-partisan operations until late 1943. During this time the division was re-designated as a Panzer division.

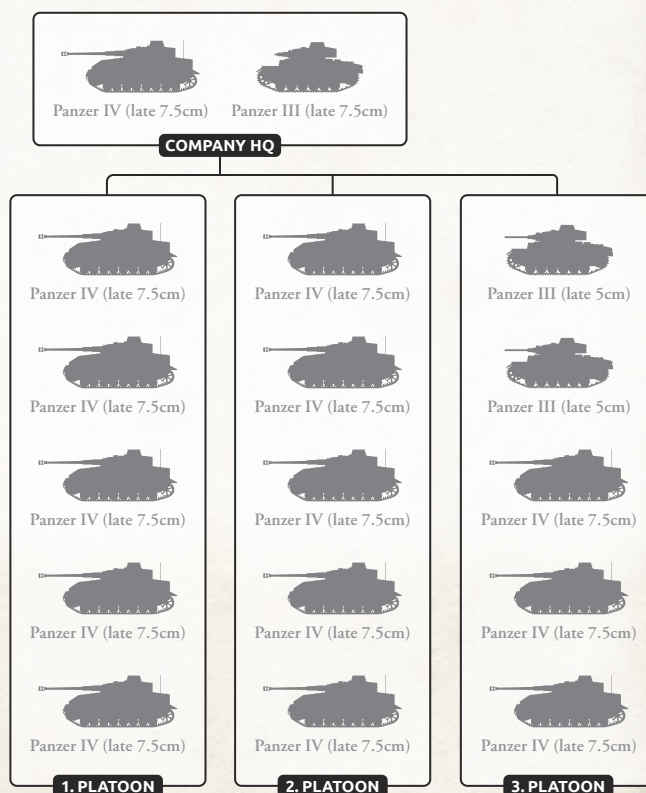
1. SS-PANZER DIVISION LSSAH, II SS PANZERKORPS, FEBRUARY–MARCH 1943

While some panzer battalions received enough Panzer IV tanks to refit their platoons, many of the other units had to make do with a mixed arsenal of Panzer III and IV tanks, the new SS Panzer Battalions among them. The 6th Panzer Division is a good example of just how varied the platoon's tanks were.

During the Third Battle of Kharkov (February–March 1943), the regiment was heavily equipped with Panzer III and long-barrelled Panzer IV tanks, which were crucial in combating the formidable Soviet T-34s.

Around this time the regiment has 20 Panzer III tanks (this total consists of standard combat variants equipped with the long 5cm KwK 39 gun, alongside a handful of Panzer III Befehlswagen command vehicles used by tactical staff) and 85 Panzer IV tanks (the vast majority of these were the formidable, long-barrelled Ausf. G variants—frequently referred to in documentation as Panzer IV Lang—which carried the high-velocity 7.5cm KwK 40 gun critical for matching Soviet armour).

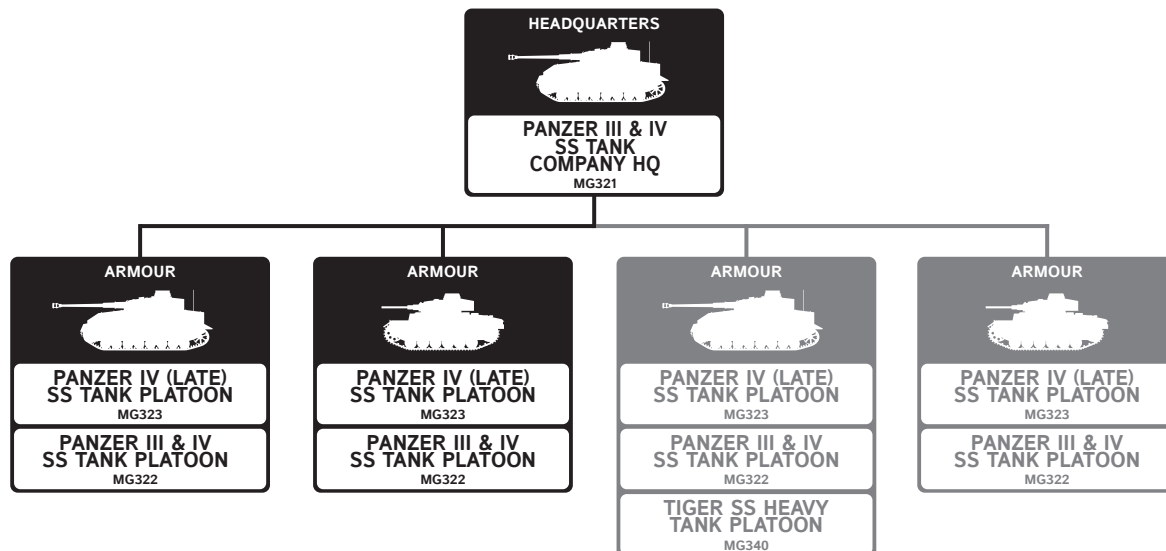
The diagram (right) is an approximation of the individual unit compositions given the available information:

In late 1942, despite the planned formation of heavy tank battalions at *SS-Panzerkorps* level, the SS panzer divisions were allowed to form a Tiger company for each of the Panzer regiments.

13. Kompanie of SS-Panzer-Regiment 1 'Leibstandarte SS Adolf Hitler' with its new Tigers arrived on the eastern front in February 1943 to take part in the battles for Kharkov.

In December 1942 the 2. SS-Panzer-Regiment 'Das Reich' formed a heavy tank company. After a period of training between January and February 1943 the company was sent back to the eastern front near Kharkov. They immediately handed

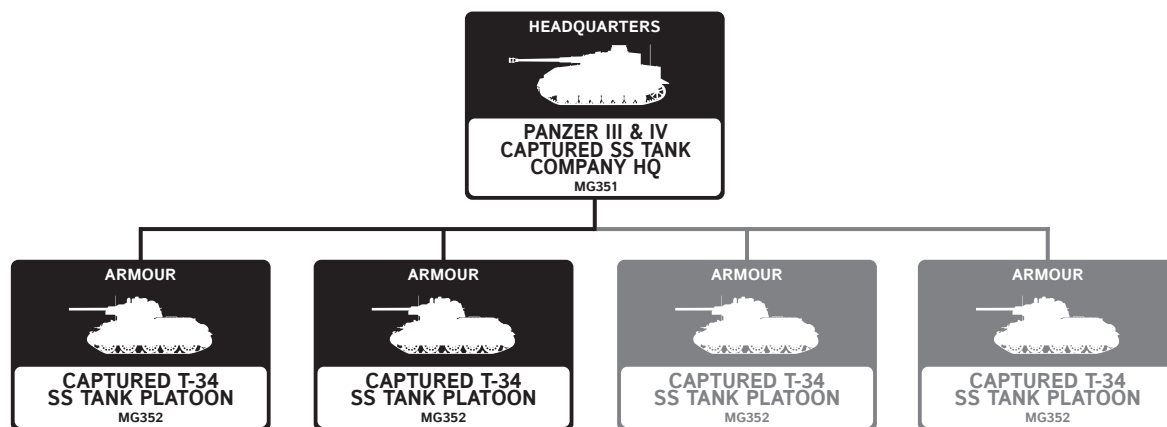
their Panzer III tanks to the regiment and retained only the Tiger Ie tanks. They were immediately in action in and around the Kharkov area. They were pushed back from Kharkov in February.

In January 1943 *SS-Panzer-Regiment 3 'Totenkopf'* received their first Tiger Ie tanks. In February 1943 these first Tigers were sent to the eastern front.

In 1943, *Das Reich* captured dozens of intact T-34s from a tractor factory in Kharkov, Ukraine, and integrated them to form their own tank sub-battalion. To prevent friendly fire incidents, the SS modified the T-34s with prom-

inent German insignia and crosses. They also installed German radios, and frequently added German commander's cupolas (from damaged Panzer IIIs or IVs) to improve visibility. These tanks were used in key engagements, including the Battle of Kursk.

2. SS-PANZERGRENAДИERDIVISION 'DAS REICH'

The *SS-Verfügungsddivision* (SS-V) participated in the campaign for the Lowlands and France. A period in France preparing for the aborted invasion of England followed before it was renamed the *SS Das Reich Division*.

Das Reich ('The Empire') was transferred to Romania to participate in the invasion of Yugoslavia and Greece. Following its participation in the successful capture of Belgrade it was again relocated to Poland to prepare for the upcoming invasion of the Soviet Union.

During the invasion *Das Reich* formed part of the spearhead of Army Group Centre. In November 1941 it came within a few miles of the Soviet capital, Moscow. Combat losses, a harsh winter, and a major Soviet counter-offensive combined to push the division back and they were pulled out and returned to France to refit as a Panzergrenadier division.

In early 1943, *Das Reich* was transferred back to the Eastern Front as part of *II. SS-Panzerkorps*. There it participated in the heavy fighting defending Kharkov. Following Hausser's withdrawal *Das Reich*, together with *Leibstandarte* and *Totenkopf*, recaptured Kharkov, smashing into the city and routing the Red Army defenders in a week.

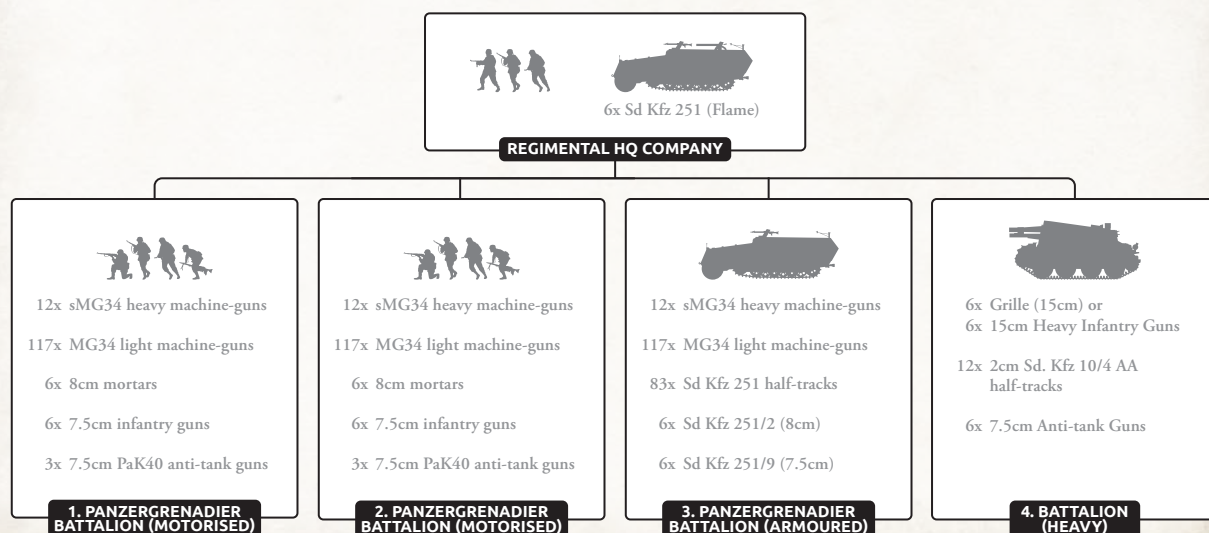
Reinforced, *Das Reich* covered the right flank of the German advance in the southern sector during the July 1943 offensive on the Kursk salient. Heavily supported by Stuka dive-bombers they pushed the advance forward in the southern sector by approximately 40 miles before the offensive was checked by a Soviet counterattack. *Das Reich*, supported by the other *Waffen-SS* divisions and Stuka dive bombers, held the counterattack at bay and accounted for some 300 soviet armoured vehicles destroyed.

Losses on both sides were horrendous and although the Soviet losses were numerically greater than those of the Germans, they were also better able to absorb and recover from them. The German offensive was cancelled and portions of the division were withdrawn to France to be refitted as a Panzer division.

However, a large part of *Das Reich* remained on the Eastern Front to hold back the massive Soviet counter-offensive for the rest of the year. This *Kampfgruppe Das Reich* was withdrawn from the front at the end of the year to rejoin the remainder of the division in France.

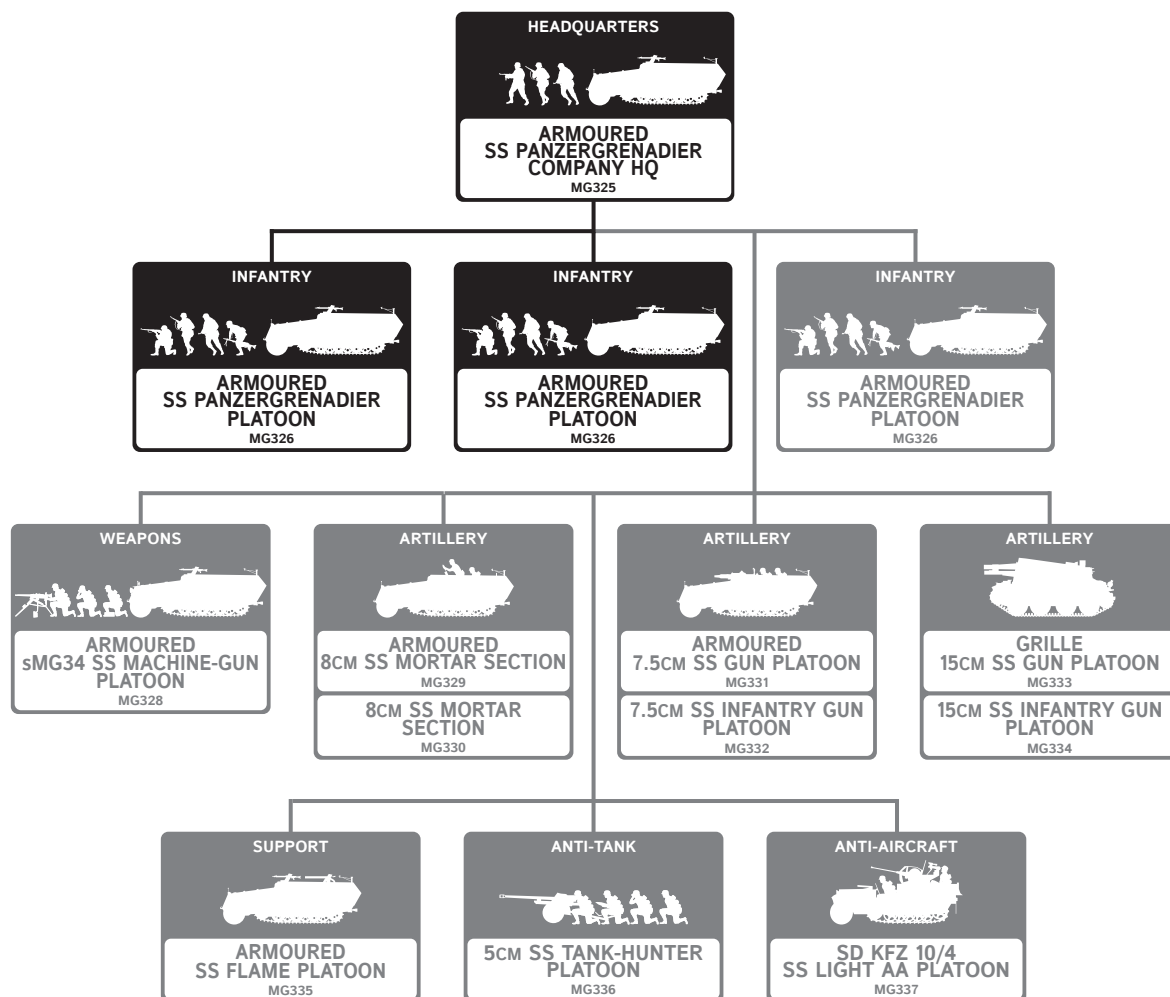

The Sd Kfz 251/9 was a new model of half-track that carried a 7.5cm infantry gun. This small battery of guns functioned a lot like the towed infantry guns found with the motorised panzer-grenadiers. The half-track's armoured protection meant that it could get close to the action to knock out threats to the infantry, using high-explosive shells with pinpoint accuracy.

The 7.5cm infantry gun was a relatively light weapon that could keep pace with the infantry and support them by putting high-explosive shells into enemy nests and strongpoints.

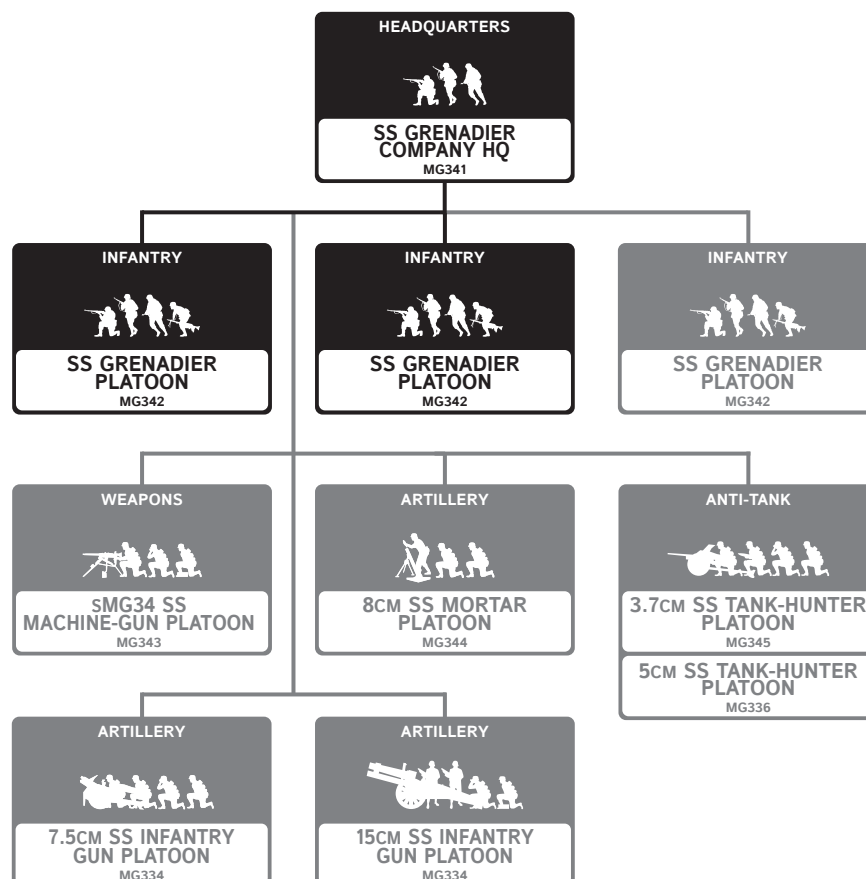

3. SS-DIVISION TOTENKOPF

Perhaps the most notorious of the SS divisions, 3rd SS-Division Totenkopf ('Deaths Head') was originally formed from the "Totenkopfverbände" units formed to guard the concentration camps in pre-war Germany.

This infamous reputation was further added to following massacres in Poland and France in 1939-40.

The Totenkopf division suffered more casualties than any other participant, at one point losing 300 officers in ten days of fighting, and greatly added to the SS reputation for aggressiveness in combat and disregard for casualties. During 1941 the division remained in occupation in France and received many new recruits untarnished by service in concentration camps.

The division participated in the second wave of the invasion of the Soviet Union as part of Army Group North. In August the division was involved in heavy fighting around Leningrad and had suffered in excess of 4000 casualties and by the end of the year was fully on the defence and down to approximately 50% strength.

In 1942 Totenkopf was encircled in the Demyansk Pocket. By April a narrow relief corridor had been forced but the division remained in place defending and by August had a strength of just 2700. The nominal strength of full infantry division should have been around 17,000. They had suffered over 13,000 casualties and been awarded 11 Knight's Crosses.

In mid-1942, the tattered remnants were withdrawn to France for refitting and upgrading to a Panzergrenadier division.
